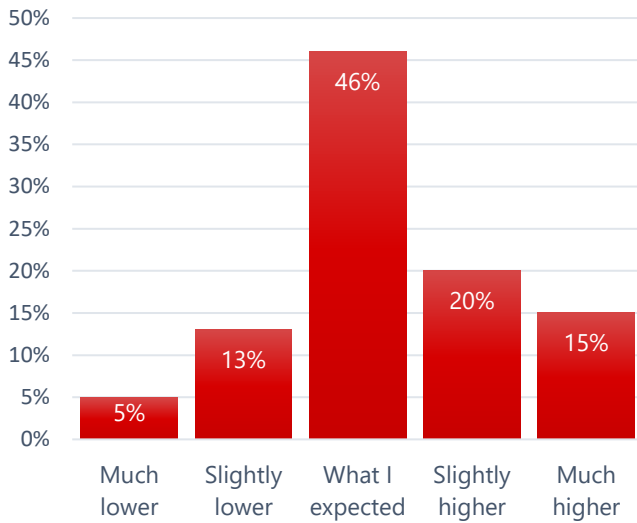

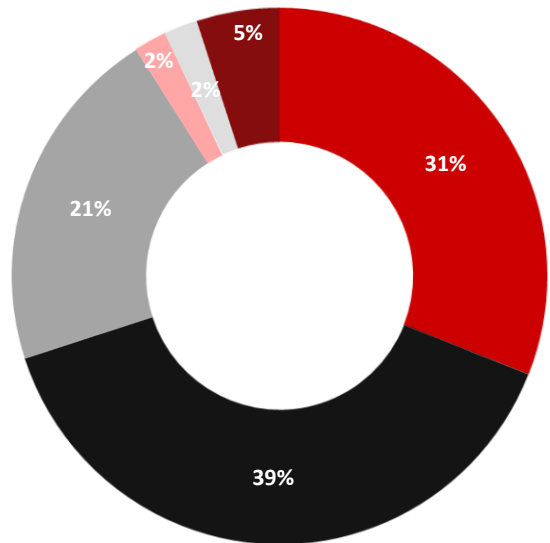
Respondents in Brand think the base rate of JobSeeker should be:
