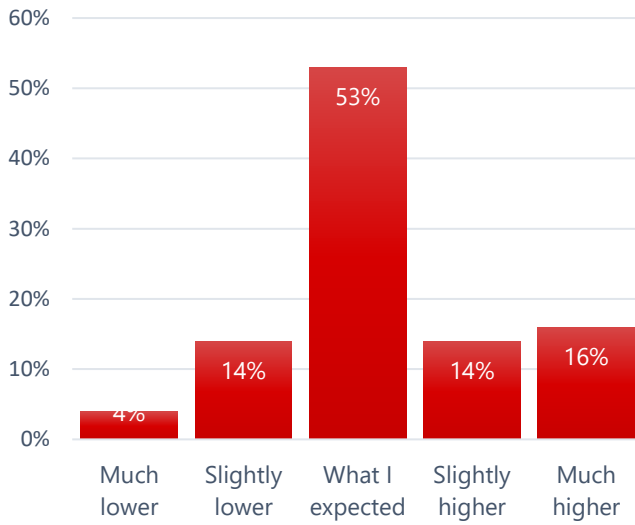

\$283 a week is encouraging poverty. The rent or mortgage payments will take up the majority of this amount. These people will end up homeless or hungry.

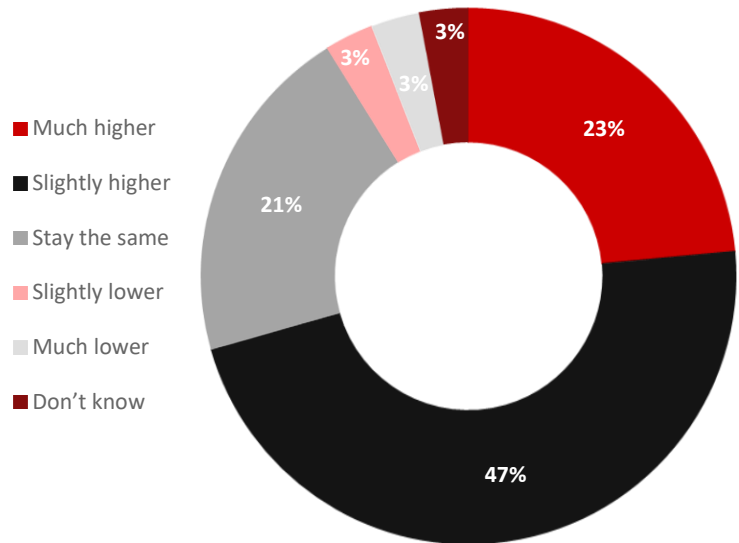
