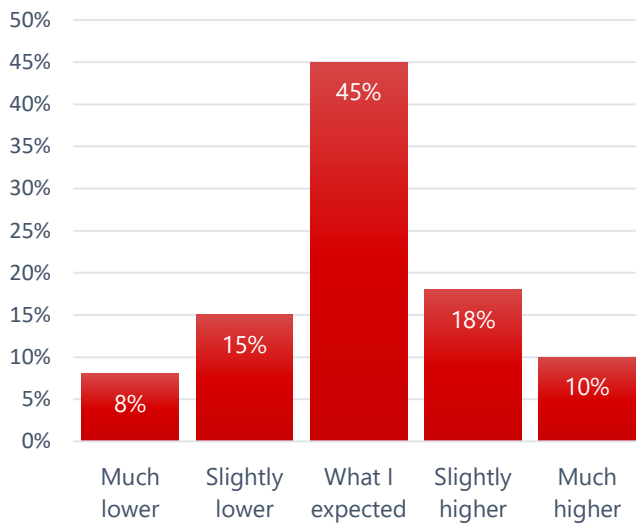

That is not even enough for rent let alone groceries and other bills.

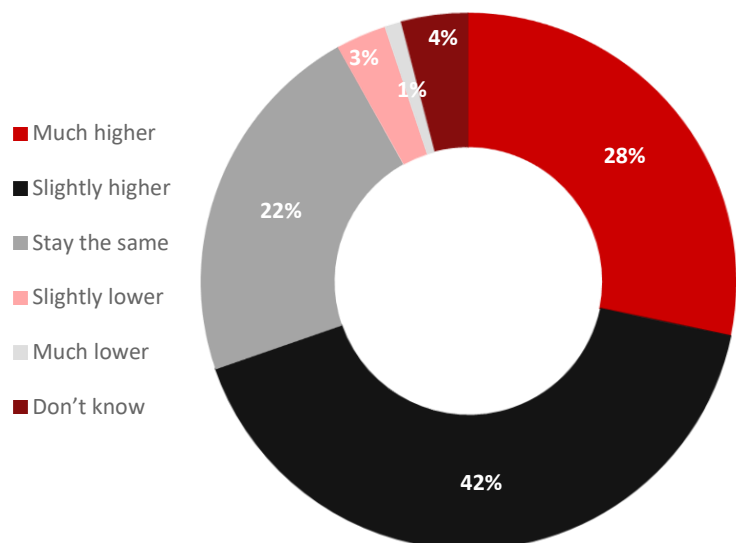
