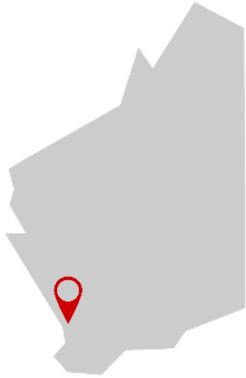


# Electorate profile: Curtin

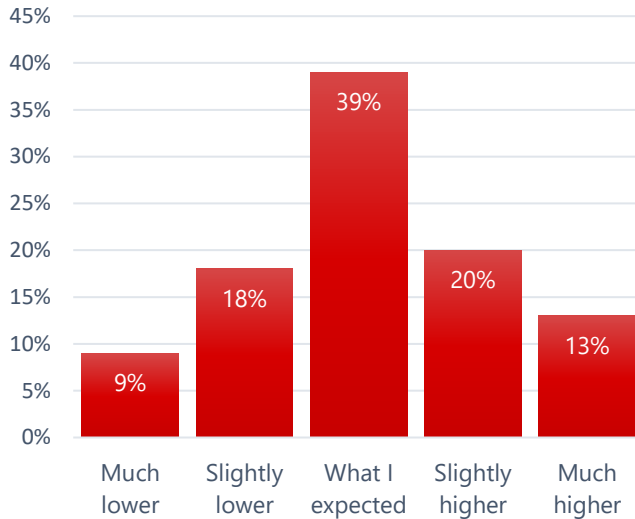

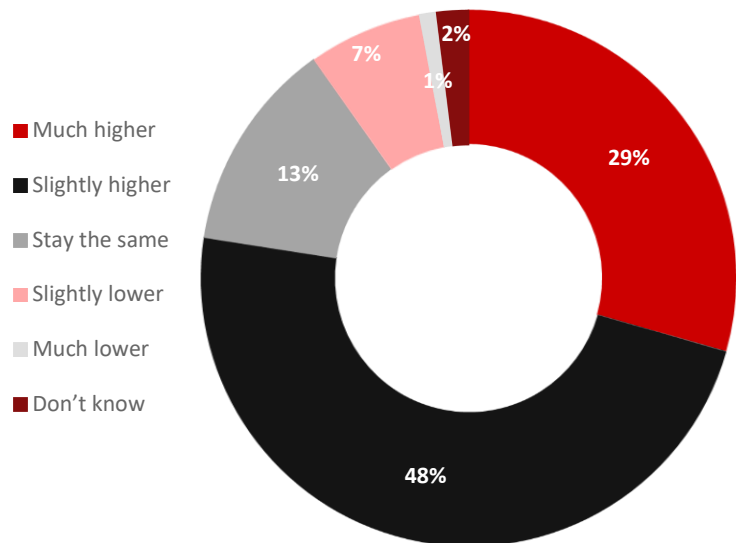


A person on the current amounts can't be expected to elevate themselves from that situation as they couldn't afford to house, feed and clothe themselves as well as get transport to job interviews.
