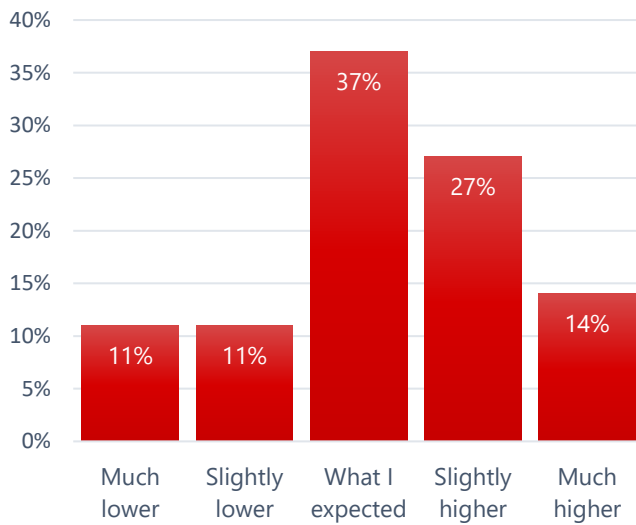

People can't live on that amount without forfeiting their right to have a place to live.

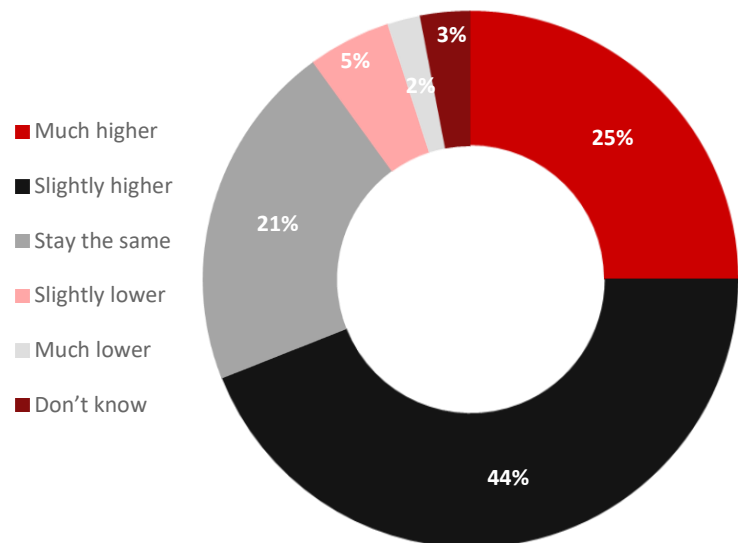
