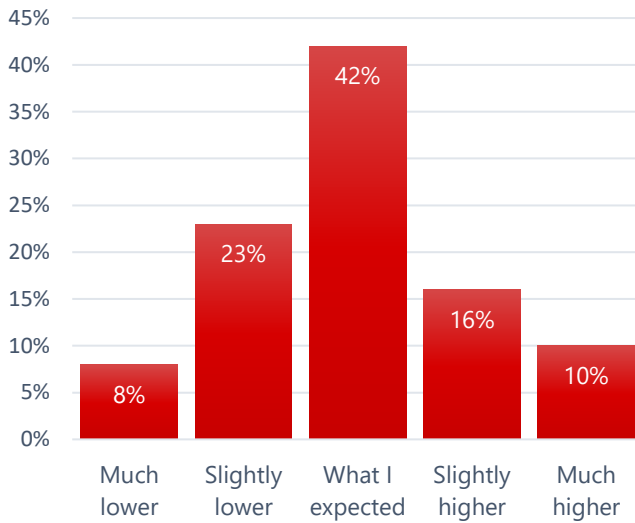

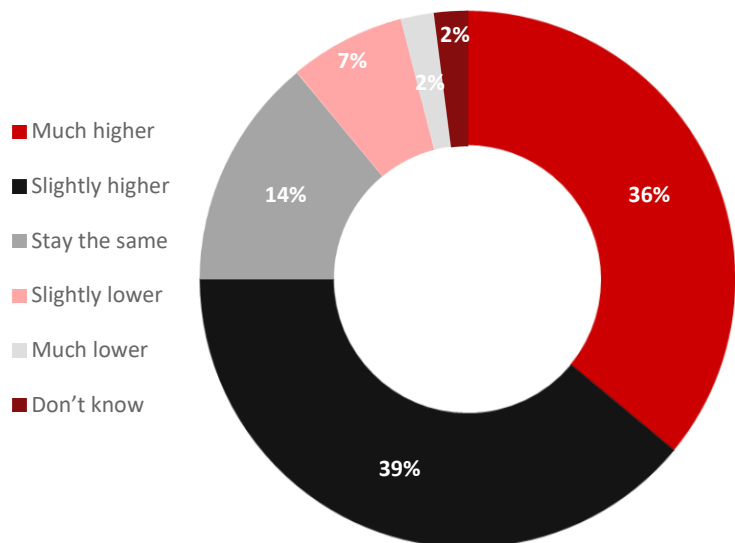


Respondents in O'Connor think the base rate of JobSeeker should be:
