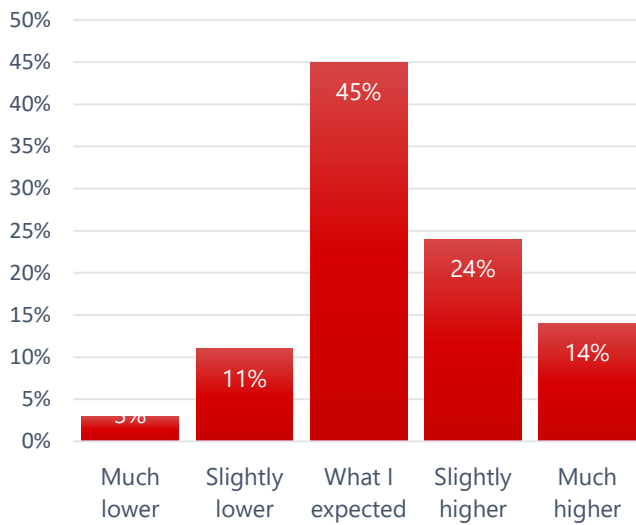

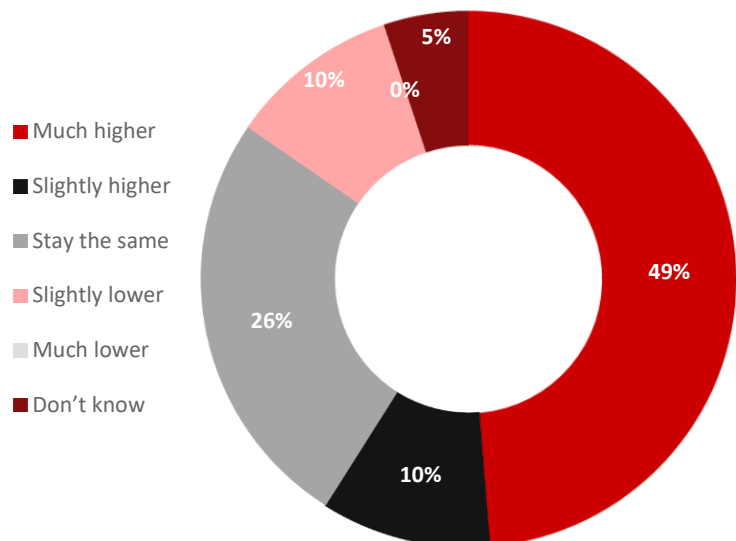


It would reduce homelessness if people could afford to live, eat well to stay healthy, stay connected to the community and get around using suitable transport.
