

The Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse will be held over three years, 2013-2016. The Commission is inquiring into how institutions responded to allegations and instances of child sexual abuse. It will make recommendations on how to improve laws, policies and practices to prevent and better to respond to child sexual abuse in institutions.

Who can make a response to the Royal Commission?

Anyone who was sexually abused while in institutional care as a child is eligible to respond. Institutional care includes schools, orphanages, sporting, church and social clubs, organisational foster care and juvenile justice centres among others.

Family members who have been affected by this experience, whistle blowers and perpetrators can make submissions to the Commission and receive support services too.
