

## BELIEVE Newsletter Autumn 2022

Last year, Anglicare WA were lucky to be chosen as the Charity Partner for the ABC Gives campaign. Shining a light on our Homelessness services, ABC Radio ran stories and interviews during the first week of December, culminating with a Radiothon.

We were absolutely BLOWN AWAY with the ABC WA community and their incredible support of the campaign, and were also amazed by how many of you, our supporters, contributed and got behind this Radiothon.

With an original target of \$100,000 (we all thought It was incredibly ambitious), we were astounded when it was reached by 9am. Clearly the WA community believe in the importance of supporting issues like homelessness, as much as you do.

With nearly 4,000 Western Australians that contributed, we raised an incredible **\$420,000!** This has allowed for state-wide support to seven different services:



- Street Connect received \$200k to ensure continued support to street-present young people across inner city Perth and suburban locations. Plus an additional \$30k was given to fit out the new bus and get it on the road.
- \$52k has been distributed to Emergency Relief to support families around the State when times get tough. This includes much needed assistance in the form of food vouchers, bill payments, help with medical supplies and other unexpected costs.
- \$50k has gone towards keeping the doors at Foyer Oxford open.
- \$50k has been allocated to people accessing our Housing First Service in Bunbury. Which prioritises getting people off the street, into permanent housing and supporting them beyond this, so they stay housed.
- \$20k has gone to Thread Together, which
  collects brand new unsold clothing from all
  around the country, saving it from landfill. We
  then distribute these clothes to people doing
  it tough.



- Kalgoorlie Accommodation Support Service
   which supports women and their children who
   are homeless or escaping family domestic
   violence has received \$10k.
- \$8k has been used to purchase new beds for the Albany Women's Centre - the only women's shelter in the Great Southern.

### KIDS TURN \$2 INTO \$10,000

As they say, from little things big things grow!

Each year in Term 4, the Year 5 students from All Saints' College participate in the "\$2 Project'.

Each student receives \$2 and is encouraged to use that capital to make as much money as possible.

Students invest the \$2 into their own business ideas and track the growth of their funds. After six weeks, students repay their initial capital investments and calculate their profit. Each student's profit is then pooled and the Year 5 cohort vote to decide which charity to donate the total profits to. This year's profits totalled \$10,815.55 which is a school record!



Year 10 Anglicare WA Ambassadors from All Saints', who had been working with us all year, talked to the Year 5's about the work we do and in particular, Street Connect, our mobile youth homelessness service. The Year 5's were so impressed by what they heard about Street Connect that they voted that all the profits be donated to this service.

We were so humbled to receive this huge cheque and we send an equally huge THANK YOU to all the budding Year 5 entrepreneurs at All Saints' College.

#### SUPPORTING THOSE DOING IT TOUGH

Now more than ever, the need for Emergency Relief (ER) support is being felt by the WA community. Lotterywest, Anglicare WA are able to provide immediate financial support for clients, helping them to meet their most basic and urgent needs. Once such person is Kate, and this is her story. \*Trigger Warning\* - Suicide and Bereavement.

Kate is a single mother with four young children, who was finding it difficult to hold down her job after the suicide of a close family member. Kate engaged with our suicide-bereavement counselling service which helped her to move forward with her life. After several months of attempting to manage this balancing act, Kate began taking some time out to grieve and focus on her family.

As a result, money became tight, and she requested short-term assistance. Our ER Coordinator worked with Kate to purchase food and clothing to free up her limited cash resources. For a short period, her financial worries were lifted, but more importantly the community support meant Kate could put her emotional wellbeing first.

Financial and emotional assistance, can be very important in supporting those impacted by suicide in the early days post-death. Anglicare WA provides active response and support.

#### **CENTRAL PARK PLUNGE**

2021 brought out the inner daredevil in people as we had a record number of Plungers register for Central Park Plunge for Anglicare WA!

In November, 50 intrepid Plungers abseiled down the Central Park building in Perth's CBD to raise money in support of Anglicare WA and ending youth homelessness.

The day was filled with highs (quite literally) and lows, as adrenalin-filled people gleefully took in the views from the roof of the building, while others conquered their fear of heights for a good cause.

A thrilling plunge down 52 floors later, and everyone safely landed in the arms of friends and family. A cumulative effort, this year's Plungers raised over \$97,000! This will make a huge difference for youth homelessness services like Street Connect and keep the Street Connect Bus out in the community.

#### **DONOR SPOTLIGHT**

We sat down with Michael Pitt, - a community superhero who has taken the plunge down the side of Central Park six times raising over \$35,000 for charity.

#### What inspires you to make a difference?

At a corporate volunteering day in 2012, my team at CBH and I were shown a video about a local charity that triggered something in my heart. Having two healthy and happy daughters, and living a relatively happy life, I decided that I could make a difference and help others.

I have been lucky enough to travel the world, and do some amazing things. While I have also faced many challenges and disappointments, spending time helping others less fortunate has been incredibly rewarding and eye opening. I encourage everyone to make time and do something that helps others outside of their world.

#### Who do you admire and why?

Sports Player: Paul Canoville - Chelsea's first black player in the 80's when racism was rife in soccer. Through all the abuse he was a fine player and an inspiration to me to stand up against the shocking behaviour we witnessed in those times. I carried this through my sporting career and helped to stamp out racial behaviour at club level, calling out people for their actions and trying to educate them.

Actor: Tom Hardy, a Londoner like myself, from humble backgrounds who was brave enough to pursue his passion despite many setbacks. Tom overcame drug and alcohol issues and turned his life around to become one of today's finest actors – proof there is always a way forward from the darkest days.

**Brave People:** Anyone who is brave enough to get out of their comfort zone, challenge themselves, embrace disappointments along the way and follow their dreams.



What type of legacy would you like to leave? In other words, how would you like to be remembered?

I'm so proud to have raised awareness at CBH of the charities that I am passionate about, including Anglicare WA and doing the plunge has also helped raise a few dollars.

I would hope that I've inspired a few people to be brave and live a life with no regrets. That they would do the things they dream of and never say "I wish I had done that, traveled there or told somebody how special they were".

Lastly, I hope I'll be remembered as a good Dad to Ava and Ellie, a great partner in crime to Karen and be remembered as a good person who tried to inspire and help others make their lives better in some small way.

#### Why do you choose to support Anglicare WA?

I strongly believe that nobody should live in poverty, particularly children, and I know that Anglicare WA strives to do as much as possible for those in desperate need. So many young people appear to start life with such a huge disadvantage and never get the opportunities that I've been lucky to have. The time and support any of us give, goes a small way to helping others out of a situation that is so often not of their making. I love the Street Connect Bus with its outreach program that provides vital support to the young people on our streets here in Perth.
