TACKLING POVERTY & INEQUALITY







Did you know that each year Australians discard an average of 23kgs of clothing per person? This growing issue of overconsumption and waste leads to increased emissions and overflowing landfills.

Thread Together is a national organisation dedicated to rescuing unused clothing, footwear and accessories and gifting them to the most vulnerable members of our community. Anglicare WA is their sole Western Australian partner.

While it may seem obvious to ensure new clothing doesn't end up in landfill, programs like Thread Together are essential in collecting, sorting and distributing these items to those who need them most.

Thread Together partners with various agencies to connect with individuals in need, many of whom are receiving support with transitional housing or job placement. Thread Together clients may be fleeing family and domestic violence, experiencing homelessness, recovering from a natural disaster or facing financial hardship.

Thread Together operates entirely on philanthropic funding, and without the

support of funding partners, Anglicare WA would not be able to deliver Thread Together in WA. Although the clothing is provided free of charge, the service relies on trained staff and volunteers to manage the Maylands Hub, maintain the Mobile Wardrobe Van and keep regional wardrobes stocked.

Anglicare WA is incredibly grateful for the City of Bayswater's assistance in establishing the new Thread Together Hub in Maylands and is excited to see it grow. With the support of Synergy, a regional wardrobe now exists in Collie, and with backing from Horizon Power, wardrobes have been established in Kununurra, Karratha, Broome and Port Hedland.

New well-fitting clothing has the power to elevate self-worth, giving individuals the confidence to make positive, lasting changes in their lives. Thread Together transforms lives, one piece of clothing at a time.

FREEDOM FROM FAMILY AND DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AND ABUSE


